Equity Lens in Public Health (ELPH) Program of Research at the Centre for Addictions Research of BC (CARBC) and the UVic Centre for Aboriginal Health Research (CAHR) are pleased to offer a 1-year master's fellowship with a focus on health equity and Aboriginal health, start date negotiable. The fellowship is an excellent opportunity to gain expertise in public health knowledge and skills with a specific focus on health equity and Aboriginal peoples. The successful candidate will have opportunities to collaborate with both ELPH program of research and CAHR affiliate researchers, communities and students as well as national and international Aboriginal health research partners. The fellowship amount is \$17,500, provided by ELPH. Workspace and a \$5,000 research stipend will be provided by CAHR.
