## Tackling Health Inequalities: Lessons from International Experiences

A new book edited Dennis Raphael looks not only at Canada, but beyond its borders to how six other wealthy developed nations approach the avoidable inequalities in health that Raphael says "haunts our societies". Tackling Health Inequalities: Lessons from International Experiences provides a unique perspective on health inequalities in Canada and elsewhere. This exciting volume brings together experiences from seven wealthy developed nations—the USA, Australia, Britain and Northern Ireland, Canada, Finland, Norway, and Sweden—to analyze their contrasting approaches to reducing avoidable health problems. Some nations

are successfully responding to health inequalities, but Canada is not one of them.
