HLBC's telehealth platform delivers high quality, comprehensive care, and health system navigation services across the continuum of care to the public and health care providers that positively impact the health care experience, health outcomes and the availability and use of health human resources to improve the affordability and sustainability of health care in British Columbia.

The Pediatric Nutrition Services Dietitian practices in accordance with the standards of professional practice and code of ethics as outlined by the College of Dietitians of British Columbia (CDBC) and within a client-centred, self-care model aligned with the vision and values of HLBC and the Primary Care Division. This role delivers efficient and effective advanced practice services to the public and other professionals, through a variety of channels including telephone, public and professional print resources, web, and email. The majority of public clients receive comprehensive medical nutrition therapy to address nutrition risk, malnutrition, and/or to prevent or manage chronic disease. Services to health professionals include internal and external consultation and collaboration to support best practices in the delivery of nutrition care and to promote the development and maintenance of evidence-informed professional and public resources.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Registered Dietitian in good standing with the College of Dietitians of British Columbia, or eligible to obtain membership with the College of Dietitians of British Columbia before accepting an offer of employment.
- One (1) year or more of recent (within last 5 years), relevant clinical experience (in pediatrics) acquired in hospital and/or in primary care or community settings.
- Experience working in multidisciplinary team settings to support client care and project work.
- Experience in the critical appraisal of the scientific literature and ability to synthesize, interpret and integrate evidence into decision making and practice.
- Experience developing reports, practice guidelines and consumer education resources.
- Experience in the use of relevant software such as electronic health records, MS Office (Word, Outlook and Excel) and web conferencing tools.
