An integral member of a multi-disciplinary Community Mental Health Team and in coordination with other community agencies and professionals, you provide a range of mental health services to children, youth and their families, when the child or youth is suffering from serious emotional, psychological, behavioral or psychiatric illness.

As a Clinician, you provide direct clinical services such as intake, assessment, diagnosis, treatment, and crisis intervention for children, youth, and their families. Consulting with community agencies, schools, hospitals, and other ministry programs, you understand the importance of being involved in community education, development, coordination, and prevention/early intervention programs. You build and maintain relationships with a wide variety of stakeholders in the community to ensure that conflicts are resolved, and appropriate outcomes are achieved.

High Risk/Outreach Clinician, CYMH - Smithers (1 permanent part time position (0.5 FTE), 35 hours biweekly)

The High Risk/Outreach Clinician provides short term, intensive clinical services including risk assessment, safety planning, crisis intervention and stabilization care plans for children and youth experiencing acute mental health and/or substance use challenges. The High Risk/Outreach Clinician provides urgent mental health care in community, using an integrated service approach, to reduce the need for hospitalization and provide aftercare to help clients return home to community from inpatient services. This role works closely with families and caregivers to support the implementation of treatment recommendations and the day-to-day care and supervision of children and youth experiencing acute mental health and/or substance use challenges.

Through consultation, the High Risk/Outreach Clinician collaborates with regional service providers and will build and maintain relationships with community mental health and substance use services, local hospitals and Indigenous agencies to support continuity of care and integrated service delivery for children, youth and families.
