Youth Forensic Psychiatric Services (YFPS) provides inpatient and outpatient court-ordered and court-related assessment and treatment services to young persons according to the Youth Criminal Justice Act and other relevant federal and provincial statutes. YFPS also provides services to young persons found unfit to stand trial and youth found not criminally responsible due to a mental disorder (NCRMD) under the Criminal Code of Canada.

The Community Nurse assumes responsibility for an individual caseload and provides consultation and teaching to other professionals and agencies. This role also contributes to program development. The Community Nurse works on a multi-disciplinary team, which provides direct care to adolescents with a broad range of mental health and behavioural problems. Nurses at this level provide case management, family therapy, group and one-on-one counselling, care planning and nursing care delivery services for groups of care recipients in a community.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Bachelor's Degree in Nursing with a Master's Degree in a clinical human services field such as social work, child and youth care, counselling psychology, clinical psychology etc.; **OR**
- A Master's degree in Nursing.
- Licensed to practice nursing under the British Columbia College of Nurses and Midwives.
 - **NOTE:** If your degree was obtained outside of Canada, you need to confirm it has been assessed for equivalency through the International Credential Evaluation Services (ICES). You must provide a basic report by the closing date of this posting to be considered.
- Two (2) years of recent experience providing in depth clinical counselling services to clients who have a combination of physical, psychiatric and/or concurrent substance abuse/misuse disorders.
- Must possess and maintain a valid class 5 BC Driver's license with no restriction or equivalent (i.e. from another Canadian Province).
