**Superintendent of Health Professions and Occupations Oversight
Office of the Superintendent of Health Profession and Occupation Oversight
Vancouver or Victoria, BC**

The Office of the Superintendent of Health Profession and Occupation Oversight is responsible for administering the duties of the Superintendent as required under the Health Professions and Occupations Act and for providing centralized oversight of health profession regulatory colleges. The Office is a centre of expertise in health professional governance in B.C. and works to ensure regulated health profession colleges under the Act are transparent, accountable, and operating in the public interest. The Office is an independent oversight body led by the Superintendent.

The Superintendent of Health Profession and Occupation Oversight reviews and evaluates legislative, regulatory and policy framework and operations for the effective oversight of professional regulatory bodies governed under the Act and provides advice to the Minister. The Superintendent sets and monitors governance standards and bylaws for regulated health professions, conducts audits, general reviews, and investigations of health profession regulatory bodies, and makes recommendations to the Minister regarding the regulation of additional health professions under the Act. Further to that, the Superintendent implements and runs a merit-based selection process for recommending board members of health profession regulatory bodies to the Minister for appointment, establishes a public complaint system to investigate matters relating to health profession regulatory bodies, the Act, or any regulations under the Act. The Superintendent also promotes reconciliation with Indigenous peoples in B.C. and supports awareness of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

The ideal candidate for this unique role uses superior people skills to build and maintain key strategic relationships with professional regulators, industry, Indigenous Nations and partners, and senior government officials. Operating at an Assistant Deputy Minister level, they are an experienced leader with the ability to balance the multiple interests and competing priorities of complex regulatory oversight who models discretion and integrity in every interaction. Using their knowledge of the professional legislative and regulatory environment of B.C.'s health profession regulation sector as their guide, the ideal candidate exhibits and inspires

personal and professional credibility, leadership, confidence, and an understanding of other people's perspectives and interests.
