Youth Custody Services provides Secure and Open sentenced custody as well as remand and pre-court detention for youth in custody under the Youth Criminal Justice Act. Youth Justice contributes to public safety by promoting the development of law-abiding behaviour primarily through an integrated, multi-disciplinary approach.

As a Nurse, you are a member of the interdisciplinary team and provide comprehensive nursing care to youth in custody under the general direction of the Health Care Services Supervisor, or Correctional Supervisor. You consult with youth, families and members of the interdisciplinary team and develop individual plans supporting needs of youth in custody.
