**Occupational Health Nurse

The Workplace Health and Safety Branch (WHS) provides the BC Public Service with health planning and promotion, occupational safety, occupational health and rehabilitation, and disability benefits administration services, through regional offices in Vancouver, Victoria and Kamloops. The mandate of WHS is to build a workforce culture of safety and health, by delivering services and information to public service managers and employees that support them to manage their health and improve workforce productivity.

Under the direction of the Healthcare Team Practice Lead, the Occupational Health Nurse (OHN) manages disability cases, provides advice, support, and coordination of resources for employees and their supervisors, and identifies opportunities for early intervention, to help ill and injured employees return to sustainable work as quickly and as safely as possible.

The BC Public Service is committed to creating a [diverse workplace](#) to represent the population we serve and to better meet the needs of our citizens. Consider joining our team and being part of an innovative, inclusive and rewarding workplace.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Registered Nurse, or a nursing degree from an approved school of nursing.
- Occupational health nursing education OR equivalent occupational health education.
- Must have or be immediately eligible to obtain registration with the British Columbia College of Nurses and Midwives, formerly known as the College of Registered Nurses of British Columbia.
- Six (6) months or more of occupational health nursing experience.
- Six (6) months or more of disability case management experience.

Preference may be given to candidates with:

- Certificate in occupational health nursing OHN(C) and/or specialized training in occupational health.
- Active membership in an occupational health nurses' professional practice group and participation in continuing education, related to disability case management.
