There are two (2) types of Indigenous Clinician positions are available:

SPO 24 MH - Indigenous Clinician, CYMH (the role is conducted in the MCFD office)

SPO 24 MH - Indigenous Outreach Clinician, CYMH (the role is conducted in the community).

Indigenous Clinician, CYMH

\$85,563.25 - \$97,633.20 annually which includes a 4 Grid Temporary Market Adjustment*

The Indigenous Clinician, Child and Youth Mental Health (CYMH) provides direct clinical services for Indigenous children, youth and their families. This role provides group and family therapy while incorporating Indigenous cultural perspectives and provides consultation with community agencies both on and off reserve. This role also provides consultation and training to MCFD clinicians to increase awareness in the development of culturally appropriate assessments, planning and treatment for Indigenous children and youth and their families.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Master's in Counselling, Social Work, Educational Counselling, Clinical Counselling, Clinical Psychology or Child and Youth Care or comparable graduate degree at the master's level in a similar subject may be considered.
 - NOTE: If your degree was obtained outside of Canada, you need to confirm it has been assessed for equivalency through the International Credential Evaluation Services (ICES). You must provide a basic report by the closing date of this posting to be considered.
- Minimum of one year full-time equivalent experience working with children and youth and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services.
- Must possess and maintain a valid class 5 BC Driver's licence with no restriction or equivalent (i.e. from another Canadian Province).

Preference may be given to applicants with the following:

- With more than two years recent (within the last five years) post-Master's Degree full-time equivalent experience providing mental health services to Indigenous people and communities.
- With recent experience providing services utilizing an outreach model.
- Who self-identify as First Nations, Métis or Inuit with the required combination of education and experience.
